
North American Invitational, Inc.

Tractor Pulling - Yesterday, Today. . . Tomorrow

Men have become involved in competitive sports for centuries for many reasons, but Tractor Pulling has only recently evolved in the 20th century with the advent of internal combustion engines. Tractor pulling got its start in 1929, in two different areas of the U.S. - Bowling Green, Missouri, and Vaughnsville, Ohio. Originally tractors pulled a flat-bottom wooden sled loaded with rocks.

As machines grew and H.P. increased human weight became popular, spectators were asked to set 10 ft. apart and walk out onto a flat metal sled in order to stop the tractor from moving.

Intense safety promotion and rapid increases in tractor pulling technology prompted the introduction of the present day Mechanical Weight Transfer Machine.

Tractor pulling has become involved in one of the most unified, rigid safety pograms of any competitive motor sport. Each tractor is required to meet proper shielding and construction specifications. This safety equipment includes items such as 3/8" steel drivetrain shields, automatic break-away kill switches, and tip-over protection pads on the rear of the tractors.

Tractors are separated into classes according to the weight of the tractor and its driver. Each

tractor must not exceed the weight of the class in which it is entered.

What makes you a Winner? Today, power, traction, strength and balance are all key factors in the Battle for Victor over the Weight Transfer Machine.

Each driver wants to pull the weight machine as far as possible, until the tractor runs short on power or loses traction. After forward motion ceases, a measurement is taken and recorded as the pullers distance. The farthest pull is the winner.

In the early 70's, many State Assns. were formed and tractor pulling swept across Rural America. In 1977, over 16 million people viewed almost 1500 tactor pulls in the U.S. and Canada. Last year some 2,000 competitors traveled across America in an attempt to capture their share of the \$17 million paid in prizes.

Tractor pulling has progressed beyond comprehension in the past 10 years. Today it has become "The fastest growing sport in Rural America".

The Weight Transfer Machine

Today's modern weight transfer machines use a relatively simple concept to accomplish the formidable task of stopping tractors generating in excess of 3000 H.P. The object of tractor pulling is to pull the sled or weight transfer machine as fas as possible.

As each tractor hooks to the sled, the weight box starts from a rearward position with the weight concentrated over the rear wheels on the sled. A series of chains, gears and transmissions propel the weight box a given distance up the rail for each revolution the wheels on the sled make. As weight is transfered off of the sled wheels and onto the actual skid pan (where the tractor is hooked), down pull is increased on the drawbar; thus increasing the HP necessary to maintain motion.

After each tractor has pulled, the weight box is returned to its rearward position, as tractor classes change, the weights may be added to the weight box or a faster gear may be selected to increase the speed in which the weight box moves forward.

Most weight transfer machines are capable of transferring 35-40,000 pounds and have a total combined weight of 60,-70,000 pounds.
